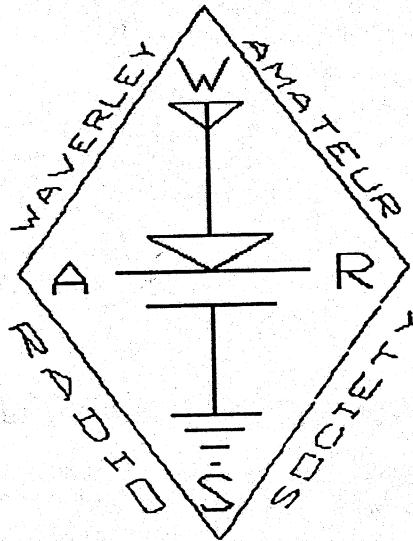

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I WISH TO RESPOND TO THE OVERLY EMPHATIC LETTER BY WAYNE ON CLUB MEMBERSHIP AND INDIVIDUAL PARTICIPATION. I FEEL THAT IT OUGHT TO BE POINTED OUT THAT ALTHOUGH OBVIOUSLY HE IS ENTITLED TO HIS POINT OF VIEW, IT IS NOT MINE AND POSSIBLY NOT A COMMON ONE EITHER. I GUESS IT CANT BE A COMMON ONE OR ELSE HE WOULDN'T HAVE NEEDED TO WRITE IT!

THERE ARE A LOT OF REASONS WHY A CLUB HAS AN ACTIVE SMALL PARTICIPATING GROUP, A 'FOCAL CORE', WHILST THE MAJORITY ARE PERIPHERAL AND SHOW A LOWER LEVEL OF ACTIVITY. WHATEVER THE REASONS ARE, THEY ARE VALID FOR THE INDIVIDUAL CONCERNED AND COERCION WITH MORAL BLACKMAIL ARE LIKELY TO DO PRECISELY THE OPPOSITE EFFECT TO THAT INTENDED. PERHAPS THE NON-ACTIVE MEMBERS MAY CANCEL THERE MEMBERSHIP ENTIRELY, OR AT LEAST BECOME MORE DISTANT, AFTER SUCH VERBAL ABUSE. THE TRUTH IS THAT WE DO NEED THESE PEOPLE - NOT ONLY FOR THERE WELCOME FUNDS, BUT BECAUSE THEY FORM A RESERVOIR OF POTENTIALLY ACTIVE MEMBERS, AND ALSO ACT AS A FORM OF CONTACT TO OTHER POTENTIAL MEMBERS.

PERHAPS THE CRUX OF THE MATTER IS THAT AMATEUR RADIO IS A HOBBY, AND BY DEFINITION HAS TO TAKE BACK PLACE TO WORK, FAMILY AND OTHER COMMITMENTS. EVEN AS A HOBBY, INTEREST CAN VARY FROM YEAR TO YEAR AND FROM ONE SECTION OF THE HOBBY TO ANOTHER. I AM AWARE OF MANY MEMBERS WHO GIVE AMATEUR RADIO, AND WARS, THE TIME THAT IS SUITABLE TO THEIR WORK, LIFE, AND INTEREST - IT SEEMS TO ME THAT THIS IS THE WAY IT SHOULD BE. ALSO I CONSIDER IT BETTER TO HAVE AN ACTIVE CORE MEMBERSHIP COMPOSED OF PEOPLE WHO ARE THERE BECAUSE THEY WANT TO BE, AND NOT FOR OTHER LESS WORTHY REASONS.

FINALLY, ON A MORE CONTENTIOUS POINT, I DOUBT THE VALIDITY OF THE CONTINUAL PUSH TO INCREASE THE CLUB MEMBERSHIP. I DO THINK THAT PUBLICITY IS WHAT COUNTS, SO THAT INTERESTED PEOPLE KNOW WARS EXISTS AND CAN JOIN IF THEY CHOOSE, AND EVEN THAT THE CLUB SERVICES SHOULD BE TAILORED TO ATTRACT PEOPLE WITH DIFFERENT AMATEUR INTERESTS. I DO DOUBT HOWEVER THAT THE ESSENTIAL QUALITY OF THE CLUB WILL IMPROVE, SINCE IT SEEMS TO ME THAT THIS HAS LITTLE TO DO WITH NUMBERS, MORE TO DO WITH THE CHARACTERS OF THOSE CONCERNED. I LOOK BACK A FEW YEARS AGO, WHEN THE ACTIVE CORE WAS ONLY A FEW PEOPLE, NOTABLY JOHN ZWART AS PRIME ACTIVATOR PERHAPS, AND I FOUND THOSE DAYS NO LESS ENJOYABLE THAN NOW, WHEN THE MEMBERSHIP HAS INCREASED. I HAVE NO DOUBTS AT ALL THAT THE CLUB IN THAT FORM WOULD HAVE CONTINUED HAPPILY, EVEN THOUGH SMALL.

I DO REALISE THAT THIS LAST POINT IS A LITTLE UNUSUAL, BUT THEN AMATEURS ARE KNOWN FOR THEIR LITTLE ODDITIES AND ECCENTRICITIES!

JOTA REPORT

I was recently contacted by the Assistant Area Commissioner for activities, Central Sydney District, in regards to providing operators at the scout activity centre Bankstown for the JOTA weekend.

This is the second and by far the most viable request that we have had to date, and in view of other circumstances, we have decided that we will provide operators for the Scout Centre, as well as providing operators at our club station.

Last year, the Scouts request for operators went almost unheard, even though there were several requests on the WIA broadcasts. As they have made a direct request for our clubs' assistance, I am sure that our members will assist in any way they can to ensure that the weekend will go smoothly.

If you can assist with JOTA on the 20th and 21st of October this year, please leave your name with any of the committee members as soon as possible. This will assist us in completing the arrangements necessary to ensure there are no hiccups on the day.

JOTA is quickly approaching. At this stage we look as if we might have 3 groups to look after this year at 3 different locations!!!. So could all operators please mark down the following dates in their diaries and let us know ASAP if you can help. October 19,20,21, 1990.

The first group looks like it may be operating out of the Scout hall at Bankstown. At this location a fully operational station is maintained all year round. The second group will be operating from the scout camp at Pennant Hills and the third up in the Blue Mountains (at a location yet to be fixed).

At the time of writing it is still unclear how many operators will be required or if it will be possible to man all the above locations. But we are hopeful that with your co-operation that we can make this year one of the best ones yet both for the Scouts and for the Club.

AMATEUR TELEVISION IS ALIVE AND WELL IN SYDNEY

Amateur television in Sydney is represented by two clubs. These are the Gladesville Amateur Radio Club (GARC) and the Sydney Amateur Television Group (SATVG). The clubs transmit respectively from Lane Cove and Springwood on Channel 35+ UHF, i.e., 579.25 MHz vision, 584.25 MHz sound. There are other non-affiliated amateurs also using the tone-accessed ATV repeater at Springwood (input 426.25 MHz), and otherwise experimenting on frequencies such as 1.2 and 10 GHz.

GARC transmits four times a week on Channel 35 and transmits a repeat of its Wednesday night test transmission to Springwood (VK2RTS) on Thursday nights by request, using equipment supplied by the SATVG for that purpose. The Thursday night transmission enables interested parties in areas west/south-west not served by Gladesville direct to see at least one transmission a week. GARC is a club deeply interested in education both for amateurs and for the public about amateur radio and allied technical matters and this is reflected in the material transmitted.

A typical Wednesday night test transmission with a "live" presenter will commence with the second half of a lecture by club lecturer Ron VK2DQ on Amateur Radio Theory, followed during the evening by news from GARC, SATVG, WIA and ANARTS interspersed by taped material on such topics as soldering, space science, safety with electricity, amateur-generated videos etc. This is retransmitted on Fridays for the benefit of those who could not watch on the Wednesday with all tapes re-inserted to retain quality. On Saturday the emphasis is on computers, often by way of lectures from the club lecturer or other club members. Sundays commence with a photographic accompaniment to the voice relay of the WIA broadcast followed by videotapes on diverse and informative topics.

With the low-power transmission originating in Lane Cove West, the coverage stretches from Bondi in the east to Pymble, west to the top of the Blue Mountains, and south to The Oaks, Campbelltown and Loftus. The signal is best received with a band 4-5 antenna, a masthead pre-amp tuned to Channel 35 (not broadband) and low-loss coaxial cable. Both pre-amps and low-loss coax are available from GARC. The transmission times are: 7.30 pm Wednesdays, 7.00 pm Fridays and Saturdays, and 7.15 pm Sundays. A test screen with ID is on air for some time before the transmission to allow for equipment tuning.

If your club members are interested you are welcome to attend the Wednesday night transmission and watch the crew in action, coffee and biscuits provided. Contact the club by phone on 427-0530 to arrange a night.

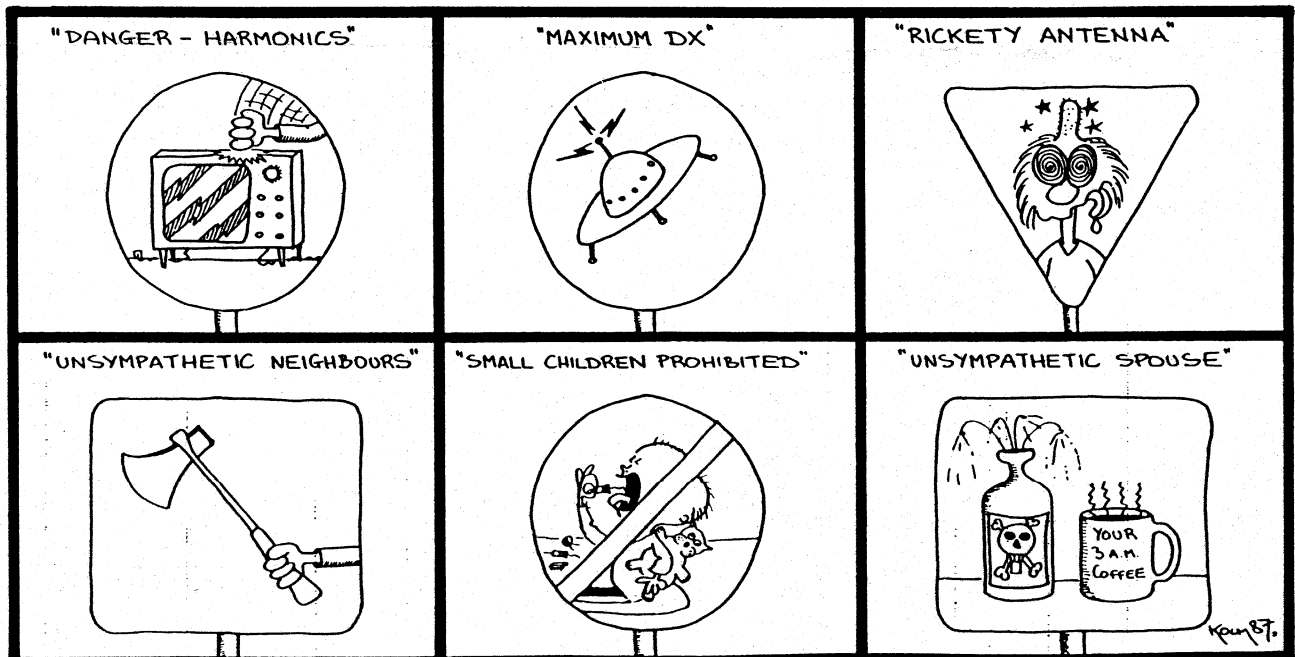
LATE NEWS

TAHMOOR REPORT

On Friday March 23, Brett, VK2XMU, myself and two members of my family travelled to the Tahmoor Scout camp where we setup a fully operational amateur station, which included HF, VHF, UHF and Packet. After setting up aerials between two conveniently grown trees we tested all the equipment and then bedded down for the night in a tin shed at the campsite.

The next morning, Jochen, VK2TKK & Leslie arrived to provide our base communications, with Eric, VK2KUR and the twins visiting for the day.

The Scouts commenced their rafting trip at 1000 whilst we started the arduous task of following them from the cliff tops. We managed to follow them without too many problems until midday when we were halted by a rather large cliff which proved to be impassable. The scouts failed to keep in radio contact, so we were not able to inform them that we had to abandon the hike at this point.

We returned briefly to the campsite where we had lunch, and then proceeded directly to the exit point to await the arrival of the scouts. The scouts began to arrive later than scheduled, and in fact it was just on dark when they began to arrive. We were then informed that three members of their party were stranded upstream due to equipment failure.

From here on in, things became somewhat complicated. We managed to establish communications on 27 MHz, and the three persons stranded insisted on being extracted that night. Due to this insistence, the risk that the scouts wanted to take, as well as other local circumstances, required that the local police be informed.

This resulted in the attendance of the police and State Emergency Services at the site, and the subsequent planing of a rescue attempt.

Several things by this stage had occurred, which is at the moment the subject of other reports to the relevant authorities.

The end result was that the scouts managed to extract themselves at first light on Sunday morning.

We did prove that we had an efficient communications system which worked where other systems failed. Our thanks must go to both Jochen, VK2TKK and Rick, VK2KRF for all their assistance during this exercise.

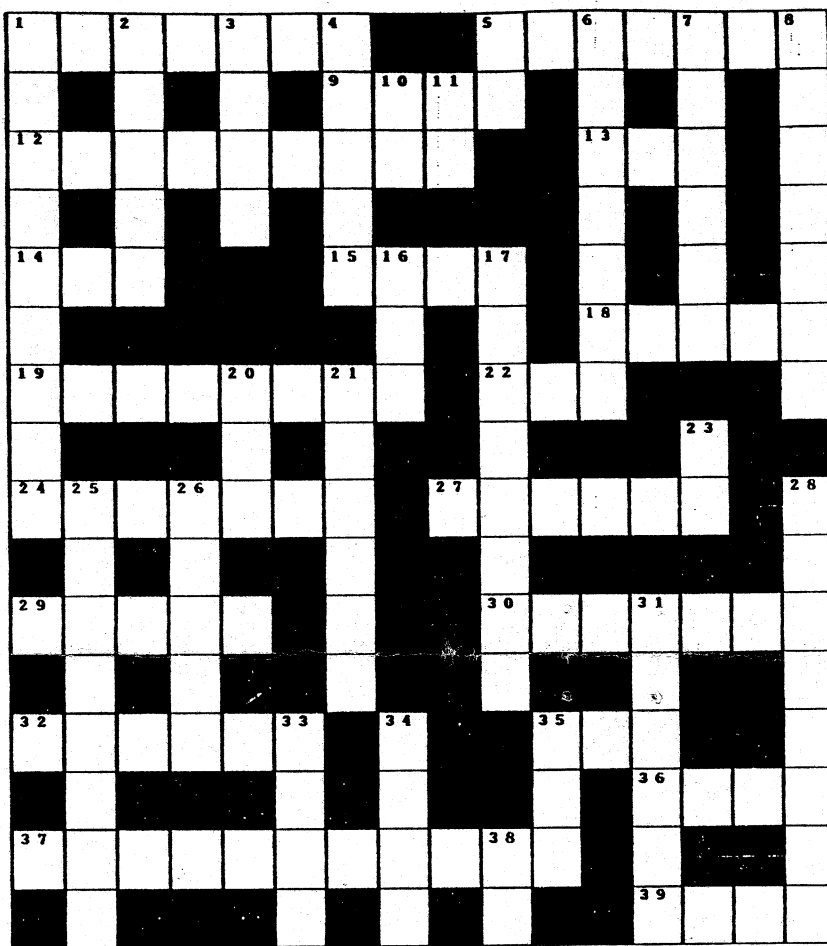
